The Day of the Lord is "near and hastening fast," and it will be "a day of distress and anguish, a day of ruin and devastation" (Zeph. 1:14, 15). Our weekly chapel offerings in November & December go to support Latheran Bible Translators; specifically, the workers in Papan New Guinea. This important


ministry provides copies of Bibles and other Gospel-centered materials for individuals around the world in their native languages. To date.
