Welcome! Jesus Is the Word and Wisdom of God, Who Gives You Life and Light in His Flesh. Jesus is the divine Word by whom all things were made, who has become flesh and dwells among us. He gives His flesh "for the life of the world," not only as a sacrifice for sin but as "the living bread" from heaven (John 6:51).
